MEETING REPORT

Two major decisions were made at the February meeting. The first was in regard to club dues, and it was decided that all 1977 dues are to be payable immediately, that dues will now run from the time they are paid until one year from that time, instead of until the next following April as we did it in previous years, and that there will be two different types of membership - flying and non flying.

Flying members will receive the Updraft, be rated (MassHGA rating, not USHGA, but this will be sufficient to fly MassHGA sites), and will be allowed to vote on all matters before the association. Dues for flying members will be ten dollars per year, payable at once for 1977. The Board of directors had suggested a figure of \$8 per year, but the general membership voted to raise the figure

at the meeting.

USHGA members will receive a two dollar discount on memberships.

Non-flying members will pay \$5 per year, half of the full rate, and will receive the Updraft and be welcomed to attend MassHGA meetings. but will not have a vote on matters that affect flying at MassHGA sites.

The other major issue decided at February's meeting is that MassHGA is to host a meet at Skinner Park in April, to be a qualifier for the USHGA National Championships. Details must be arranged, but the Board is working

on this right now.

It was decided that the meet will NOT be publicized to the general public, to keep crowd conjestion to a minimum, however, all pilots in Region 8 will be invited to fly.

Of course, there can be only a limited number of qualifying meets in any region, so it will be neccessary to get formal USHGA Region 8 approval before plans can be finalized.

The remainder of the meeting was an audio-visual event. Bob Judd brought along a copy of Bill Bennett's latest promotional film in sound and color, "PHOENIX COUNTRY," The film was really excellent, and featured flying in numerous worldfamous locations around the globe. Actually, it was the best film by a hang glider manufacturer that we have seen yet.

After Phoenix Country, Ray the bartender turned on the color TV so those who were into it (most of us) could watch Baa Baa Black Sheep in color. As usual, this show was also

excellent.

USHGA members please send your USHGA membership card or a photocopy of it so that you can get the two dollar discount. Those who want to join USHGA at this time, but are not presently members, can send the \$8 MassHGA dues plus \$15 for USHGA, and your USHGA membership will be forwarded at the same time by Sue.

USHGA membership includes your entry into the internationally recognized Hang Badge rating program, voting privlidges (ballots by mail) in USHGA, and a subscription to the HANG GLIDING Magazine, which alone is well worth the cost of membership in USHGA, plus 50 thousand dollars individual pilot liability insurance.

All members of MassHGA are encouraged to join USHGA as well.

MassHGA membership cards will be returned to you as soon as you have sent your check to the Treasurer.

Fresent members are urged to re-up at once, as you will NOT delay the expiration date of your '77 membership by delaying payment - we know who you are, and your expiration date will be March 1st, '78, whether you pay up now or later.

MEETING NOTICE

The March meeting of the MassHGA will be held, as usual, on the third Tuesday of the month, which will be March 15th. The location, as always, will be the ME Bar & Lounge on Rt 47 in Hadley, two miles north of Skinner State Park on Mt. Holyoke.

We also hope to show a flim at either this meeting or the next which has been called the most exciting aviation film ever made. It's called "TO FLY", and it was made for the National Air and Space Museum at the Smithsonian, where it is shown daily as part of the exhibit.

INSURANCE

Don McCabe, Region 8 Director, informs us that USHGA hopes to have site and landowner and instructor liability insurance available by late spring or early summer. If this happens, MassHGA will cease its efforts to find an individual policy for this association, and will take part in the USHGA program for all of our flyers, sites, etc.

RATINGS UPGRADING

Flight Director Chuck LaVersa. and Stu Smith, both USHGA Examiners and Observers, have been considering holding some ratings clinics to allow local flyers to upgrade their ratings. The MassRGA presently has a number of pilots who should be at a transitional stage at this time. so if you're one of them, here's your chance!

Pilots are reminded that each level of the USHGA system requires both a written or oral test and a flight test. Flight tests include a selection of tasks involving mancuvering in flight and landing accuracy. It is NOT possible to do all of these tasks in a single flight. so be forewarned that the flight test portion of the rating exam is likely to be an all-day project at best.

Due to the fact that the Hang 3 and Hang 4 tests require several high-altitude flights, it will not be possible to do these ratings until the park opens for the season and the road 1s clear.

Classes 1 & 2, however, can be done at any time. Interested pilots should contact Chuck directly at 665-4962 to begin making

arrangements for testing.

Also, GSI-rated pilots who wish to convert to USHGA at the same level should contact Chuck. as this transition is quite easy to make, and well worth while for those who expect to do any flying away from our local hills this season. USHGA will be required most places, so get your ratings!
